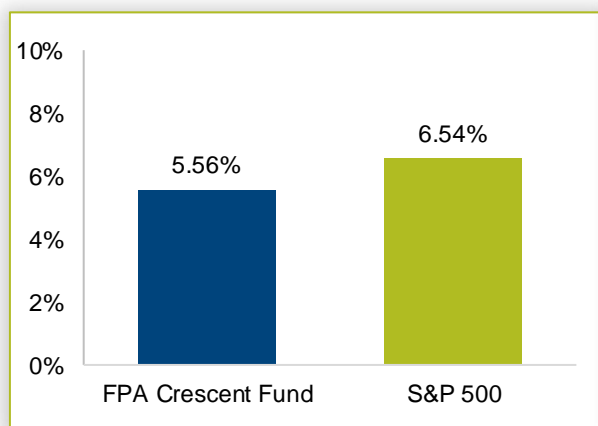


Fund objective met thus far in current market cycle

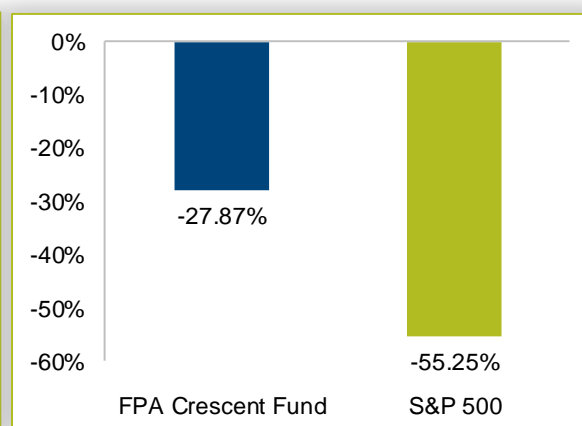
Investment objective: The FPA Crescent Fund seeks to generate equity-like returns over the long-term, take less risk than the market and avoid permanent impairment of capital.

Equity-like returns



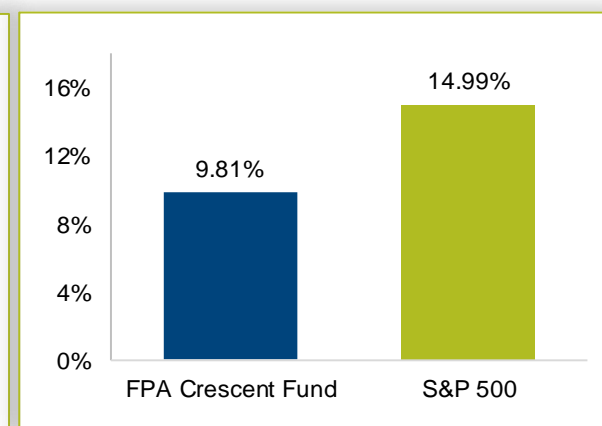
Annualized total return

- We believe our flexible approach enhances the likelihood that we may deliver an equity-like return with less risk over the long term.
- Since 2007, we have sought to preserve capital during large drawdowns.

- Our downside capture increased in 2015-2016 partly because of increased exposure to the financials sector and more cyclical businesses. At the time, we believed these were some of the few areas of the market still offering opportunities.
- Our downside capture in late 2018 is partly explained by our increased net risk exposure. We were able to increase our net risk exposure by approximately 1000 bps during 2018 because of increased volatility in our portfolio holdings and global equity markets. As of December 31, 2018, many of our holdings were trading at multi-year valuation lows based on various measures.

Time periods referenced above reflect S&P 500 drawdowns greater than 10% and are calculated from that index's peak and trough dates, (i.e 10/10/2007-3/9/2009, 4/23/2010-7/2/2010, 4/29/2011-10/3/2011, 7/20/2015-2/11/2016, 1/26/2018-2/8/2018 and 9/20/2018-12/24/2018). The Fund added exposure to large capitalization stocks beginning around 2007 and added exposure to developed non-U.S. and emerging market stocks beginning around 2009. Upside (/downside) capture ratio is used to evaluate how well an investment manager performed relative to an index during periods when that index has risen (fallen). The ratio is calculated by dividing the manager's returns by the returns of the index during the up (down) -market, and multiplying that factor by 100. **Net Risk:** Percentage of portfolio exposed to Risk Assets. Risk asset generally refers to assets that may have a significant degree of price volatility.

Index Definitions

The Standard & Poor's 500 Stock Index (S&P 500) is a capitalization-weighted index which covers industrial, utility, transportation and financial service companies, and represents approximately 75% of the New York Stock Exchange (NYSE) capitalization and 30% of NYSE issues. The S&P 500 is considered a measure of large capitalization stock performance.

The MSCI ACWI Index is a free float-adjusted market capitalization weighted index that is designed to measure the equity market performance of developed and emerging markets. The MSCI ACWI consists of 44 country indices comprising 23 developed and 21 emerging market country indices.
