


Fund objective met thus far in current market cycle

Investment objective: The FPA Crescent Fund seeks to generate equity-like returns over the long-term, take less risk than the market and avoid permanent impairment of capital.

Equity-like Returns


Annualized Total Return

Downside Protection


Average Return During -10% or larger S&P 500 Drawdowns During Current Market Cycle

- The Fund’s downside capture increased in 2015-2016 partly because of increased exposure to the financials sector and more cyclical businesses. At the time, we believed these were some of the few areas of the market still offering opportunities.
- The Fund’s downside capture in early 2020 is partly explained by increased net risk exposure. We increased the Fund’s net risk exposure by approximately 1000 bps during the drawdown because of increased volatility in the Fund’s holdings and global equity markets. It is also explained by the Fund’s exposure to the financials sector and more cyclical businesses.

Long term will generally include bear markets (20%+ declines) and other large corrections. Time periods referenced above reflect S&P 500 drawdowns greater than 10% and are calculated from that index’s peak and trough dates, (i.e., 10/10/2007-3/9/2009, 4/23/2010-7/2/2010, 4/29/2011-10/3/2011, 7/20/2015-2/11/2016, 1/26/2018-2/8/2018 and 9/20/2018-12/24/2018, 2/19/2020-3/23/2020. The Fund added exposure to large capitalization stocks beginning around 2007 and added exposure to developed non-U.S. and emerging market stocks beginning around 2009. Downside capture ratio is used to evaluate how well an investment manager performed relative to an index during periods when that index has fallen. The ratio is calculated by dividing the manager’s returns by the returns of the index during the down market, and multiplying that factor by 100. Key Terms:

Drawdown is the peak-to-trough decline of a portfolio during a specified period, before a new peak is attained.

Net Risk Exposure is the percentage of portfolio exposed to Risk Assets.
