The index focuses on the large-cap segment of the market, with over 80% coverage of U.S. equities, but is also considered a proxy for the total market. Morningstar Large Blend Average consists of portfolios that invest in a variety of large US stocks. Stocks in the top 70% of the capitalization of the US equity market are defined as large-cap. The blend style is assigned to funds where neither growth nor value characteristics predominate. The Russell 2500 Index consists of the 2,500 stocks that cover the small and mid cap market capitalizations. The Russell 2500 is a market cap weighted index that includes the smallest 2,500 companies covered in the Russell 3000 universe of United States-based listed equities.

⁵ From time to time, the Fund may buy and sell the same security within a short period of time. The frequency of trading within the Fund impacts portfolio turnover rates. A high rate of portfolio turnover (100% or more) could produce higher trading costs and taxable distributions, which would detract from the Fund's performance. The U.S. Value Fund, formerly known as the Perennial Fund, had a turnover rate of 117% from June 15, 2015 - October 15, 2015 due to the Fund's transition during that time period.

⁶ Active Share is defined as "the percentage of the fund's portfolio that differs from the fund's benchmark index".

⁷ 12-Month Trailing and Forward P/E are calculated using weighted harmonic averaging, which helps avoid extreme results that may occur due to small relative numbers.

⁸ Price/Book ratio is the market price of a stock divided by the book value per share.

⁹ Return on Equity measures a corporation's profitability by revealing how much profit a company generates with the money shareholders have invested.

¹⁰ Debt/Equity is the measure of a company's financial leverage calculated by dividing its total liabilities by stockholder's equity.

¹¹ Debt/Capital is the measure of a company's financial leverage calculated by dividing its total liabilities by its total capital.
