The performance and other statistics shown reflects the historical performance of the Fund when Bragg Financial Advisors, Inc. ("BFA") served as investment adviser of the Fund. From inception of the Fund to December 31, 2004, BFA and it affiliates voluntarily absorbed certain expenses of the Fund and voluntarily waived its management fee. Had BFA not done this, returns would have been lower during that period. Effective January 1, 2005 through October 31, 2020, BFA charged a single unitary management fee and contractually agreed to pay all operating expenses of the Fund except for brokerage, taxes, interest, litigation expenses, and other extraordinary expenses.

As of the most recent prospectus, the Fund's Total Annual Operating Expenses is 0.99% (Investor Class), 0.91% (Advisor Class), and 0.80% (Institutional Class). Prior to November 1, 2020, the Fund had a unitized fee structure that limited annual operating expenses to 1.18%.

2024 Summary - Performance

- The Fund outperformed its benchmark in 2024, returning 10.76% vs. 8.05% for the Russell 2000 Value Index. We are pleased with this outperformance in an up market.
- Over the four largest peak to trough drawdowns for the Russell 2000 Value Index, the fund averaged a 68.6% downside capture.¹ This is in line with our history and our expectations.
- As of 12/31, the Fund's cash position stood at 9.3%.

- Significant Adds: Enstar (ESGR) and Science Applications (SAIC)²
- Corporate Actions: We received smaller positions in Brookfield Asset Management (BAM), Everus Construction (ECG) and Arcadium Lithium (ALTM)
- Sold: United Natural Foods (UNFI)
- Bought Out: American Equity Life (AEL), Livent (LTHM) and Aaron's (AAM)
- Reduced: Deckers (DECK), Fabrinet (FN), CSW Industrials (CSWI), Graco (GGG), Interdigital (IDCC) and Sprouts (SFM) - high-quality compounders that performed well and got expensive and large
- Turnover: 19%, in line with history

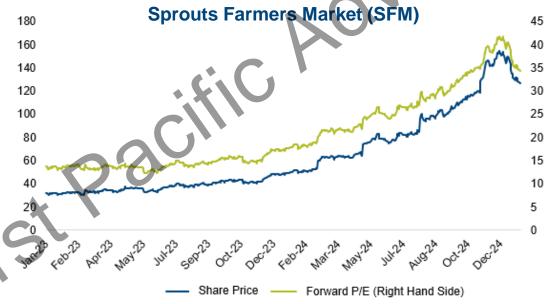

High Quality Compounders

- Our investment strategy primarily seeks to buy high quality compounders and hold them for the long term. Tax efficiency is an additional consideration of this strategy.¹
- Several of our compounders performed very well and approached the upper end of our "range of reasonableness" on valuation - Interdigital (IDCC), Sprouts (SFM) and CSW Industrials (CSWI).
- Last year, the Fund started using ReFlow Fund, LLC ("ReFlow"). ReFlow helps to manage the Fund's share redemption process and allows us to make redemptions in-kind ("RIK"). We anticipate that this process, due to the ability to make RIK, may also help increase the tax efficiency for the Fund.¹

InterDigital	4.8	2018 ¹	InterDigital (IDCC) is a research and development organization that develops and acquires wireless and video patents. The company has a history of strong financial performance, opportunistically buys back shares, and pays a modest dividend. IDCC has been successfully renewing its wireless licensing agreements (Apple in 2022, Samsung in 2023) and has a growing stream of recurring licensing revenues across consumer electronics, internet of things (IoT), and automotive customers.
TD Synnex	4.1	2012	TD Synnex Corp (SNX) is the largest information technology (IT) distributor in the US and has successfully evolved to sell its customers more high value services, software and cloud offerings. We believe the company can continue to take share, improve margins and will use its cash flow to pay down debt and buy back shares at attractive prices.
ServisFirst Bancshares	4.1	2020	ServisFirst Bancshares (SFBS) is a conservatively run lending franchise helmed by Tom Broughton. Tom hires local bankers but doesn't build branches – this allows for best-inclass efficiency metrics while maintaining a strong and conservative lending culture. Return on equity (ROE) and average earnings per share growth were near 20% for the 10 years through 2023 – very attractive for a conservative, plain vanilla commercial lender.
Sprouts Farmers Market	4.0	2021	Sprouts Farmers Market (SFM) is a grocer focusing on fresh, natural and organic products. The company has best-in-class margins, attractive returns on capital, great new store economics, and accelerated unit growth from 12 stores a year to 35 stores in 2024 on a base of roughly 400 stores. ² Over the past year, the stock has performed well after reporting strong operating results and starting from a reasonable initial valuation.
Fabrinet	3.6	2014	Fabrinet (FN) is a contract manufacturer of optical communications components and modules. The company has a dominant position in hard-to-replicate precision-manufacturing technologies and an enviable track record of execution. The majority of Fabrinet's sales are to networking equipment manufacturers, but it has been successfully diversifying into the data center, industrial, auto, and medical end-markets.

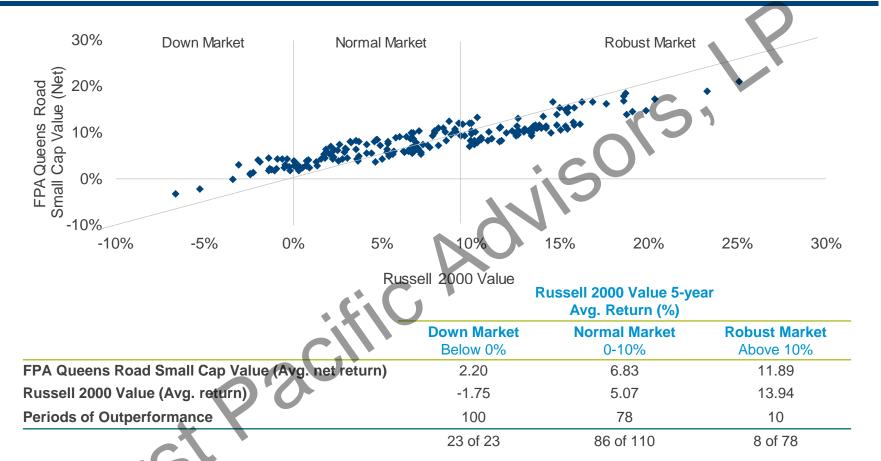

Downside capture ratio is used to evaluate how well an investment manager performed relative to an index during periods when that index has fallen. The ratio is calculated by dividing the manager's returns by the returns of the index during the down market, and multiplying that factor by 100. bps or basis points; 1 bps is equal to 0.01%.

FPA Queens Road Small Cap Value Fund & Russell 2000 Value: Growth of \$10,0001



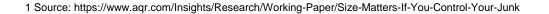

Quality Small-Caps

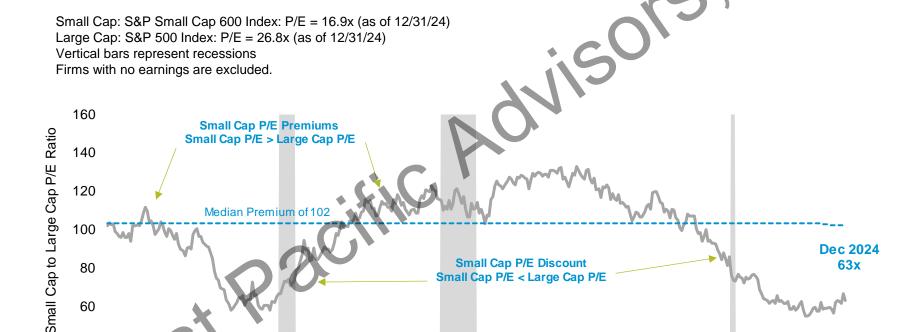
We have been writing about quality in our letters.

- Small-caps trade at a significant discount to large caps
- But the small-cap indices are "junky"
- AQR's "Size Matters, If You Control Your Junk"
- 24Q2 Letter We looked at earnings consistency as a sign of quality. We found that, on an apples to apples basis, comparing large and small companies with similar levels of earnings consistency, the small-caps were considerably cheaper.
- This makes the case for an investment of actively managed small-caps.



Small Caps are Compelling

Third time in approximately 30 years that small caps have sold at this large of a discount.

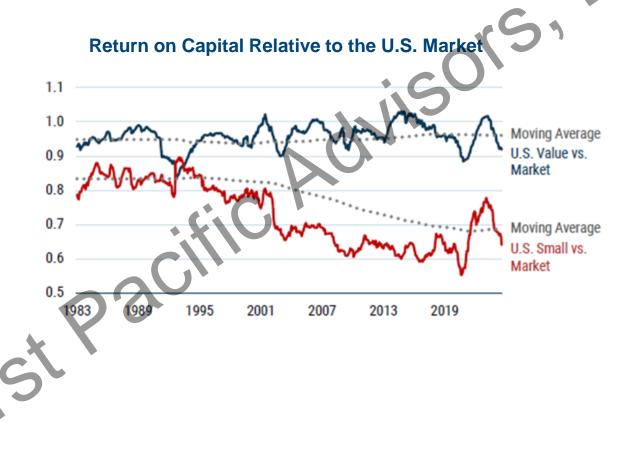


Small Cap to Large Cap Historical P/E Ratio (x100)

No changes to the Fund's principal investment strategies were made in connection with these changes in management of the Fund, and Steve Scruggs, CFA, Director of Research and Senior Portfolio Manager for BFA, continues to serve as the portfolio manager for the Fund.

Index / Benchmark / Category Definitions

Other Definitions

Active Share is defined as the percentage of the Fund's portfolio that differs from the Fund's illustrative index. Calculated using weighted harmonic averaging, which helps avoid extreme results that may occur due to small relative numbers.

Beta describes the activity of a security's returns responding to swings in the market. A security's beta is calculated by dividing the product of the covariance of the security's returns and the market's returns by the variance of the market's returns over a specified period.

Downside Capture is a statistical measure of an investment manager's overall performance in down-markets. It is used to evaluate how well an investment manager performed relative to an index during periods when that index has dropped.

Forward earnings per share is a price-to-earnings ratio that uses forecasted earnings for the P/E calculation.

Free Cash Flow represents the cash a company can generate after required investment to maintain or expand its asset base.

The Global Industries Classification Standards, or GICS®, is a common global classification standard developed by S&P Dow Jones Indices and MSCI. As of August 2024, the GICS structure consists of 11 Sectors, 25 Industry groups, 74 Industries and 163 sub-industries.

Max Drawdown is the largest peak-to-trough decline quoted as a percentage during a specific recorded period of an investment.

Price/Earnings Ratio (P/E) is the price of a stock divided by its earnings per share. Percentages are based on the absolute number of shares. P/E ex-Neg EPS is Price/Earnings ex negative earnings per share.

Return on Equity (ROE) measures a corporation's profitability by revealing how much profit a company generates with the money shareholders have invested.

Sharpe Ratio is a risk-adjusted performance metric used to determine the additional return for each unit of risk. It is calculated by subtracting the risk-free rate from the average return over a period of time and dividing the result by the standard deviation of the returns during that period.

Small-cap Value Companies: The term small-cap describes companies with a relatively small market-capitalization. A company's market-capitalization is the market value of its outstanding shares. The definition for small-cap varies, but generally means a company with \$300 million to \$2 billion in market-capitalization.

Sortino Ratio is a risk-adjusted performance metric used to determine the additional return for each unit of downside risk. It is calculated by subtracting the risk-free rate from the average return over a period of time and dividing the result by the standard deviation of the negative returns during that period.

Standard Deviation is a measure of dispersion of portfolio's return relative to its mean and is calculated as the square root of the variance.

Trailing earnings per share is a company's earnings generated over a prior period (often a fiscal year) reported on a per-share basis.

Upside/downside capture ratio show you whether a given fund has outperformed--gained more or lost less than--a broad market benchmark during periods of market strength and weakness, and if so, by how much. Upside capture ratio is calculated by taking the fund's monthly return during months when the benchmark had a positive return and dividing it by the benchmark return during that same month. Downside capture ratios are calculated by taking the fund's monthly return during the periods of negative benchmark performance and dividing it by the benchmark return.

Morningstar Categories

Morningstar Small Value portfolios invest in small U.S. companies with valuations and growth rates below other small-cap peers. Stocks in the bottom 10% of the capitalization of the U.S. equity market are defined as small cap. Value is defined based on low valuations (low price ratios and high dividend yields) and slow growth (low growth rates for earnings, sales, book value, and cash flow). As of December 31, 2024, there were 497 funds in the category.

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
